CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH WEEK

February 4th to 10th marked Children's Mental Health Week and the School Council were busy promoting being happy and healthy across the school. PARKING SAFELY AND RESPONSIBLY

Can we once again please urge all who drive children to school to park both legally and responsibly. Zig zags and yellow lines are there for children's safety - by parking on these (even for a few moments) you are putting children and other road users at risk.

We ALL want to avoid anybody getting injured due to irresponsible parking.

You are aware that four bus services are being cut through our village by First Buses, which is being attributed to the 'irresponsible parking' of our parents. As a part of our lovely community, we again ask you to not park illegally (which we know that the vast majority of you always adhere to), nor park in a manner which could be determined as dangerous or irresponsible. Please consider our children, their family members, our neighbours, pedestrians, and other road users, including the buses, when parking your car and please keep waiting times to a minimum to reduce congestion. Parking on a bend does present greater challenges for buses to pass <u>safely</u> - please be mindful of this.

The bus service is an important part of our community and by parking with consideration for others, we are each helping those people within our school family and within Kingsley and Kingsley Holt who <u>depend</u>upon these services.

ATTENDANCE AND LATENESS

Attendance at school is an essential part of a child's education. We strive to work with you to provide the very best education possible and to do this we need children to attend school as often as possible and on time. We will share attendance figures on the newsletter (below), online and also on your child's report. We will also continue to offer support with any challenges you may face in terms of attendance or punctuality.

Of course, we appreciate that there are occasions when children have to be absent from school due to ill health, or medical appointments, and we thank you for your support in helping to keep all members of our school family healthy by following steps including the period of 48 hours between the last episode of vomiting and the return to school.

As a school, we will write to you if your child's attendance is low, or lateness is common, because we wish to avoid a situation where the Local Authority will issue you with a fine (please note that **school do not issue fines, nor receive any money from these)**, or Education Welfare become involved. Just to remind all, that school opens at 8.45am and the doors close at 8.55am, please ensure your child arrives during this period of time.

We want to celebrate high attendance, therefore, below are each classes' attendance for the week ending 01 March 2019 (these figures have deducted lateness as well as absence).

SAFETY ON SITE

Please can we remind you that children should **NOT** use the outdoor play area before or after school. Please can you ensure that this message is also passed to <u>anyone</u> who may also collect or drop-off your child at school.

Also, may we thank you in advance for ensuring that no dogs are brought onto the school grounds and remind you that smoking or vaping is not permitted either. Many thanks for following these steps to help the children to feel safe, healthy and reassured at their school.

HOLIDAYS

Please remember that schools are <u>not allowed</u> to authorise leave (unless in <u>exceptional</u> circumstances) in term time and any period of unauthorised leave may result in a penalty notice being served by the Local Authority.

Persistent lateness can also result in the issue of a penalty notice from the Local Authority.

As a Multi Academy Trust, we wish to support you with your child's attendance in school and avoid the possibility of any fines being issued by the Local Authority (please note that school do not issue fines, nor receive any money from these). With this in mind, should your child's attendance dip below 90%, we will write to you to advise of the situation and hopefully help to address this and prevent the Education Welfare Service becoming involved.

MANAGEMENT OF ALLERGENS IN CHARTWELLS

It is extremely important that you inform us and our school meal providers Chartwells, of any allergies/intolerances that your child has should they currently eat a school meal, or wish to start eating a school meal.

If you believe your child has an allergy/food intolerance please contact Mrs. Burton in the school office as soon as possible.

STAYING SAFE ONLINE

Please be aware there is some unpleasant content on the internet at the moment that appears to be gathering attention. The 'Momo Challenge' is an alleged form of cyberbullying that spreads through social media and mobile phones. After users are enticed to contact another user named 'Momo', they receive graphic threats from this character and are instructed to perform a series of dangerous tasks. Although this is now widely reported as being a social media hoax, it does act as a reminder for us all to be aware and vigilant online.

Please keep a close eye on what your child is looking at on the internet and ensure that they are following the age guidelines set by sites which people may use.
