SAFE AND SOUND AT THE FIRE STATION

On Monday 18th November, all of Year 6 visited Cheadle Fire Station to take part in the 'Safe and Sound' event. While we were there we took part in five sessions that could help to keep us safe. Firstly, we had a fire safety talk where we found hazards around the home. In this session, we also learned what to do in the event of a fire and how fast a fire could spread.

Next, we had a talk about what healthy and unhealthy relationships look like and we were given some scenarios to which we had to decide whether the statements were true or false. After that, we learned how to keep our money safe from scammers and what scams might look like.

The fourth session was led by Staffordshire Police, who talked to us about anti-social behaviour and what is expected from us when we are with our friends. The final session was how to deliver CPR. During this session, we learned how to deliver basic CPR and how to put somebody in the recovery position. We even got to practice CPR on dummies!

We had a great afternoon and learned lots of very important life-saving skills to keep us, others, and our families, safe and sound.

ROAD SAFETY

At this time of year, it's important to **Be Bright and Be Seen** when you are out and about near roads. BE BRIGHT – wear fluorescent or brightly coloured clothing when walking to and from school – it shows up well in daylight and at dusk.

REFLECTIVE – When it's dark outside, wear reflective clothing to be seen in car headlights. Reflective vests, sashes or wristbands work well.

IMPROVE – improve your visibility with accessories, clip on reflectors, armbands and stickers added

to your coat or bag are a great way to improve your visibility. GREEN CROSS CODE - always choose routes and crossing places that are well lit and remember to use the Green Cross Code. **HEADLIGHTS** – if you like to cycle, it's the law to have clean and working headlights on your bike at night (white at the front, red at the back) as well as a rear reflector. It's good to fit spoke reflectors too.



PLAY SAFETY AND SAFELY

Please do not allow any children to use the fixed play equipment on the grassy area at the front of school

at any time.

Many thanks for your help and for ensuring that anyone collecting your child is also aware of this important message.

ATTENDANCE AND LATENESS

Attendance is an essential part of a child's education.

As you know, school begins at 8.55am. After this time, your child will be marked as 'Late'.

Excessive lateness, or poor attendance, can lead to fines being issued to parents by the Local Authority. If your child is going to be absent for the day, you <u>must</u> call school <u>before 9.30am</u> to let us know why they will not be in - this is simply to safeguard children!
