Lost items

Please check your child hasn't accidentally picked up another child's school uniform. If this is the case, 'pop' them back into school and we will endeavour to return them to their rightful owner.

Please, please, please ensure that ALL of your child's belongings are labelled. We can always find the real owner of a labelled jumper or cardigan; anonymous items can be somewhat more difficult!

If you purchase new school uniform, please do not have suppliers embroider your child's initials in prominent places. This is not our school uniform policy.



Headlice

We seem to have an extreme case of Head lice in school, particularly in the KS2 classes, which, unfortunately, despite previous requests we are struggling to get under control. Please can we ask all parents to check their child's hair regularly and carefully for any 'little visitors' and treat accordingly. Unless everyone checks and treats their child's hair we are going to have an ongoing problem. **Help may also be available if you contact your health visitor or GP.** We really appreciate your help with this, thank you!



Bugs! - We have a couple of bugs going around school at the moment, to help stop these spreading please can you refrain from sending your child back to school until 48hours after any episode of sickness.

School Ties

We are also having an increasing number of children arriving in school without their tie. We would be grateful if you could ensure that your child wears their tie every day because, as you are aware, it is a compulsory part of our school uniform. Ties are available to purchase from the school office at a cost of £4.85.



A reminder that Lesley's delicious school dinners should be paid for **in advance** on Monday mornings. Money for any dinners paid for, but not taken will be carried over to the following week - please try not to send money in on a daily basis. This money should be in a purse, or envelope clearly marked with your child's name. £2.30 per day, £11.50 per week.



Mobile Phones and Tablets

We understand that in a few cases mobile phones are a necessity for our KS2 children who walk to and home from school. We are happy for these phones to come to school and to be handed in at the school office, at the start of the school day, where they will be kept safe, until the end of the school day. Unfortunately, we can not permit mobile phones or tablets, to be brought into school for any other reason, including Wrap Around, due to safe guarding.

We would, therefore be very grateful if you could ensure that your child/children are not bringing their phones or tablets to school, unless this is per-arranged with the school office.
