## Autumn Term Curriculum Update – Year 1

Below, you will find a brief outline of the curriculum areas which we will be focusing upon in Year 1 throughout the autumn term. Due to the unusual circumstances in the last academic year, whilst ensuring that the children are introduced to new learning, we will be also revisiting and reinforcing any learning from Reception class that the children are not quite fully secure with following the changes to school over the previous two terms. In light of the current unprecedented situation, all curriculum plans are subject to change.

	Core Subjects		
Literacy	<ul> <li>We will be learning about:</li> <li>Prediction;</li> <li>Fiction – oral and written retelling;</li> <li>Narratives and description.</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>We will also be focusing upon:</li> <li>Securing the use of known graphemes and phonemes in order to correctly spell words used in writing;</li> <li>Learning new graphemes and phonemes to aid reading;</li> <li>Exploring sentence structure and the key areas of sentence writing.</li> </ul>		
	In Year 1, we will have daily Phonics lessons to help teach, strengthen and support phonetic knowledge. Phonics is an important lesson within Year 1, as it is the building blocks of reading and writing. In school, we follow the 'Read, Write, Inc' Phonics scheme.		
	Through Guided Reading sessions, shared reading in class and individual reading, the children will be taught how to infer information, along with developing their tone, fluency and expression. To gain understanding of the texts they read, children will be asked to retell stories as well as answering questions to show their understanding of the text and their use of learnt phonics.
