Below is a brief outline of the curriculum areas which we will be focusing upon in class throughout the Autumn term in Class One.

Please note that the below is a summary and may change over the course of the term based on the children's needs and interests. It does, however, offer insight to enable you to further support your child's learning outside school.

English	<p>Our work will focus on the following texts:</p> <p>Autumn First Half – <b>The Gingerbread Man</b> by Mara Alprin, supported by Rosie's Walk by Pat Hutchins, A Great Big Cuddle by Michael Rosin, Biscuit Bear by Mini Grey and The Gingebread Man by Lesley Sims.</p> <p>Autumn Second Half – <b>I'm going to eat this ant</b> by Chris-Naylor Bellesteros, Flashlight by Lizi Boyd, Guess who is in the trees/ grass/ sand by Camilla Bedoyere</p>
Math's	<p>Number – recognising, writing and ordering numbers Addition &amp; Subtraction Fractions (Year 1 only) Shape – 2D, 3D, Position &amp; direction Measure – length, money</p>
Computing	<p>E-Safety – focusing how to stay safe when using digital devices Microsoft Word – focusing on simple typing</p>
R.E.	<p>Exploring the questions: What do Christians believe God is like? Why do Christians perform nativity plays at Christmas?</p>
History/ Geography	<p>History – My family history – finding out what life was like when our grandparents were children (1950/60's)</p>

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	Geography – People and their communities – focusing on different people and communities around the world.
Science	Who am I? Focusing our body and senses Celebrations – Focusing on different materials and seasons
Music	Keeping a steady beat/ pulse
P.E.	Ball skills & team games; this will be led by ASM
Spanish	Introduction to Spain, simple greetings, counting to 10; this will be led by Mr. Day

During the Autumn term, Class One will have P.E. on a **Monday** and **Thursday**. Please ensure that your child has the appropriate P.E. kit (including footwear) in school on these days, including an outdoor kit.
