If, however, you are having trouble accessing or navigating the site, please contact us - we will be happy to help.

As our remote education continues, we thank you for the support of your child's education through accessing the 'live' lessons and also by completing and returning work to your child's teacher. It is really important that learning is engaged with, and every moment you spend with your child makes a positive difference to their learning. Please can we request that all completed work is returned to your child's teacher once it is completed, as this way we can provide quicker feedback and plan the next steps for learning. Please, please let us know if you are experiencing any difficulties with the work and also if you are struggling with technology – we have some equipment which we can loan out to enable your child to continue to learn at home and can also offer technical advice over the telephone.
