Dear Parents and Carers,

Re: Class Three Summer Term Curriculum Overview

We are thoroughly looking forward to the Summer term and some more normality. I hope that you have had a restful Easter and that you (and your children) are ready and raring to go for the Summer term!

Below is a brief outline of the curriculum areas which we will be focusing upon throughout the Summer term in Class Three.

Please note that the below is a summary and may change over the course of the term based on the children's needs and interests. It does, however, offer an insight to enable you to further support your child's learning outside school.

English	We will study a text called Manfish by Jennifer Berne and will enjoy a class novel which will be chosen by the children themselves.
Maths	Number (up to and including 6-digit numbers) and Place value Addition and Subtraction (including decimals) Multiplication and Division Measurement – Area and Volume Fractions, Decimals and Percentages Shape – Geometry Algebra and formula (Year 6)
Computing	E-Safety and Digital Literacy Microsoft Word
R.E.	What is the worldwide church?
History/ Geography	Europe – A study of the Alpine Region
Science	Evolution and Inheritance; Growing up and growing old
Music	Children will experience a range of music through singing, listening and engaging with instruments.
P.E.	Provided by ASM sports group and Mr Day focusing on invasion games, team skills and athletics.
Spanish	Introduction to Spanish by Mr Day.

The Valley Primary School

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During the Spring term, Class Three will have P.E. on a **Monday** and **Tuesday**. Please ensure that your child has the appropriate P.E. kit (including footwear) in school on these days, including an outdoor kit.

Children in Class Three will have weekly homework consisting of –

- Ten spellings
- A weekly maths activity based on their learning in class
- Daily reading (20 minutes per day)
- The use of TTRockstars to improve their multiplication knowledge.

Homework (spelling and maths) will be set on a Tuesday to be returned on the following Monday. Spellings will be available on the school website (as per the autumn term); a paper copy of the maths homework will be sent home with your child.

A child in Class Three should be reading for twenty minutes per day. Please document this in your child's home reading diary. Your child will have a school reading book which is taken from the reading scheme and allocated to them based on their reading age, they will also have free access to the class library, they may also read anything at home which gives them enjoyment. E.g. magazines, comics.

It is greatly beneficial to your child when home and school work together as it enables them to flourish in all areas of school life. If you require any further information, please do not hesitate to contact me and I will do my best to assist.
