Cooking with Erin

Here is a small sandwich cake which can be put together quickly with a little adult supervision. It's amazing - trust me!

Ingredients:

Pre-made madeira sponge Utensils:

125g icing sugar Spoon

15ml water Knife

Strawberry jam Bowl

Strawberries Cookie cutter

Sprinkles (optional)


Recipe:

- 1) Cut the Madeira cake into circles with the cookie cutter.
- 2) In the middle of your cylinder, cut it in half to make two sides.
- 3) Make the icing by putting all of the icing sugar into a bowl and adding the warm water small bits at a time.
- 4) Put some strawberry jam on one of the sides of the cut cake.
- 5) Carefully cut up some strawberries and add them to the middle; placing them on top of the jam (ask an adult to help with the cutting).
- 6) Place the two halves of the cake together.
- 7) Put the icing on top of the cake.
- 8) If you'd like, you can add sprinkles on top of the icing.
