SEPTEMBER PLANS

Although we are starting our summer break, we are also thinking ahead to the new term and how we can remain safe. Below is useful information which is, of course, subject to change.

Arriving and departing: At the start of term, we will maintain the staggered start and finish times and the use of the two different gates. Once again, parents/carers should follow the timings given. For those of you who have children scheduled for different times, please bring both to the earliest start time available to one of their classes and collect at the latest finish time available to them, as this reduces any missed learning time (e.g. a child in Y1 with a sibling in Y6 should both arrive at 8.40am and both be collected at 3.25pm). If your children are listed to use different gates, please let us know which one you wish to use, so we can arrange for both children to be at the same place. Parents/carers should continue to queue on the driveways by the appropriate gates and not enter the playgrounds. The car park remains for the use of staff only. We appreciate that government decisions are altering, but it is our strong preference at this time that adults continue to wear face coverings, maintain social distancing and follow the one way system by keeping left!

Snacks: Children in Reception and Years 1 and 2 will be given fruit at breaktime. For all children in school (including Years 3-6), we ask that if you are sending in snacks, then this must be **one small healthy snack only** and not be crisps, sweets or chocolate, to keep children energised and ready to learn. Children are encouraged to bring a bottle of water (not juice, or pop) from home to remain hydrated throughout the day.

Uniform: All children should attend school in full and correct uniform. <u>Black sensible school shoes</u> <u>must be worn</u>. Trainers (even if they are black) boots and sandals are not school uniform and as such <u>should not</u> be worn.

Bags: We request that children bring a bag to school which is wipeable to minimise the risk of the virus spreading between school and home. P.E. bags, which should come into school on the first day of term, can remain in school and are not passing between home and school each day.

Sanitiser: Children (and staff and visitors) will still need to wash or sanitise their hands upon arrival and when leaving the school site. Sanitiser will remain available in school. If you do not wish your child to use this, please let their class teacher know.

At this time, children should not bring in toys, books etc from home. As some children wish to bring birthday treats for their classmates, please note that these will be stored in school for 72 hours before being sent home.

In September, parents/carers will remain unable to enter school and should make contact with their child's teacher via telephone or the class email address.

Wraparound: As you know, Kingsley Kingfishers were unable to provide wraparound care for our pupils last year and we worked as a school to offer help to working parents and carers through a service in school led by members of the team. In September, the wraparound provision will once again be offered by Kingsley Kingfishers (who also offer longer hours) and no longer by school.
