SAFE AND COURTEOUS PARKING

Please can we remind those who drive to school with children to park safely and responsibly and only remain parked for as long as is necessary.

Children will leave school at their stated class times and those who have brothers and sisters in other classes will both leave at the latest available time - please don't arrive until your child's/ children's designated finish time to reduce the traffic around school and to avoid you waiting for them on site. May we urge you to not stop on the zigzags - these are there to keep children safe. Similarly, please do not double park, or park on the bend as this creates risks for others. Many of our parents and carers walk to school with pushchairs - please check that if you do park by the pavement, you have left enough room for a pushchair, pram or wheelchair to pass your car safely. We are very lucky to have great neighbours to school - please continue to respect them and their driveways and entrances to their property. The small car park across the road from the front of school is **not** a public, or school car park, it is the homeowners' driveways. Parking there is the same as someone parking on your drive at home, which none of us would like.

By parking a little further away from school, you will have a few extra minutes chatting with your child as they begin and end the day and also promote a spot of healthy exercise.

SCHOOL MEAL - MENU CHANGE

Over the next few weeks, we have been advised by Chartwells, the organisation who provide school meals, that there will be a temporary reduction to the menu. From Monday 20th September, there will be one main meal choice, with the alternative/vegetarian option being put temporarily on hold due to their food and staffing shortages. Of course, in addition to the main meal, children will continue to also be able to choose from a jacket potato with a choice of filling (butter, cheese, beans, or tuna mayo), or a sandwich (ham, cheese, or tuna mayo). Apologies for this change and

hopefully they will be back to a full menu soon.

SAFETY ON SITE

May we thank you for ensuring that <u>no dogs</u> are brought onto the school grounds at any time, so we can enable the children to feel safe and reassured at their school.

Thank you for setting a good example to children by <u>not smoking or vaping on school grounds</u>.

COVID-19 SYMPTOMS AND WHAT TO DO

Coronavirus/Covid-19

Below is a list of possible Covid-19/ coronavirus symptoms: -High temperature (feel hot to touch on the chest or back); -A new, continuous cough (coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours – if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual); -A loss of, or change to your sense of smell or taste – you've noticed that you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal. Most people with coronavirus have <u>at least one</u> of the symptoms. We have also been advised that the virus

could present itself in children as an upset stomach, or headache.

If your child has <u>any of the main symptoms</u> of coronavirus: please arrange for a PCR test as soon as possible. The person displaying symptoms should stay at home until the results have been returned. Should the result be positive, then it is essential that the infected individual self-isolates as per the government guidelines and does not attend school, or come onto the school site.

If you are worried about your symptoms, or are unsure what to do, please use the NHS 111 online coronavirus service (<u>https://111.nhs.uk/covid-19/</u>). If your child is under 5 years old, call 111 straight away.

If your child has symptoms and has undertaken a test:

please <u>do not</u> return to school until results are known and shared with us.

The current governmental guidelines state that children who are close contacts of a positive Covid-19 case no longer need to self-isolate. However, it is recommended (and strongly encouraged) that if they have been a close contact, then they do take a PCR test. Of course, if your child is unwell, please keep them off school until they feel better - even if they have returned a negative result.

KEEPING COVID-SAFE

Unfortunately, as you know, we have been affected by a number of positive cases of Covid-19 in school in the short time since we returned. We have seen multiple cases across three classes and have been advised by the Local Authority team that we are at 'outbreak' point. To reduce cases, school and home must work together.

In school, at the start of term government guidelines changed for us all. We maintained a range of Covid-safe measures and have now also reintroduced others. With us facing the current situation, we ask that anyone coming onto the school site to drop-off, or collect children, wears a face covering and remains socially distanced. We appreciate that these are no longer considered necessary in public, but in your school we want to keep children, you, our staff, and all of our families safe and this will go some way towards doing so. Please help us to protect one another.

If your child displays any symptoms of the virus, <u>do not send them into school</u>. Please arrange for a PCR test and keep them at home until the result is known. If the test is positive then they must selfisolate in accordance with government guidelines and we need to know the outcome so we can follow our procedures in school. If they are negative (fingers crossed), please then keep them at home until they feel better, then they may return.

As you know, we are currently not allowing toys, teddies, pencil cases, certificates, etc to be brought into school and you have received details of what is permitted - many thanks for your support with this (if you are unsure is something can come into school - please ask). If your child has received a certificate which you wish to share with their class, feel free to email a photograph to your child's class email account. In school, we have returned to many of the 'bubble' procedures of last year, which means that the children will not freely mix between classes either inside or outside. Staff have also returned to wearing face coverings in communal indoor areas. Currently, only essential visitors are coming into the school building. If you are sending-in birthday treats for other members of your child's class, these will need to come into school at least 72 hours before they are shared, so they can be quarantined.

Parents/carers should continue to bring and collect children to and from the school gates (unless in our older year groups and you have given permission for them to walk alone) where they will be met by staff. If your child is arriving or leaving at other times to this, please come to the main entrance - but wear a face covering. From Monday 20th September, Reception children will need to be dropped and collected at the school double gates and not the railings. Please can you also support us by ensuring that your child's school bag is wiped clean when arriving home and when departing for school.

If your child is isolating at home, their class teacher will send school work to be completed each day and returned, so they can continue their learning.

Just as you, we hope that these measures will continue to reduce transmission throughout school and we thank you for your understanding that although the guidelines may change, we will also make decisions based upon our school staying safe. We are in regular contact with the Local Authority Covid Outbreak Team and are working with them to try to minimise transmission. As you can appreciate, at this time, plans, lessons, events, meetings, meals and many other things may alter, even at very short notice, and we thank you in advance for your support and understanding.

We all hope that the number of cases falls soon and even disappears, but to help it to do so, we all need to play our part in being vigilant. Please stay safe.
