

ST. WERBURGH'S RESILIENCE WEEK

As a school, we are proud to be committed to developing children's learning behaviours and to support our young stars in becoming more confident learners, especially when facing new challenges.

Through our whole-school focus upon learning behaviours, we enjoyed a special challenge to develop children's

understanding of resilience.

During 'Resilience Week', each class met a new challenge, so they (and their teacher) could build their resilience. The challenges for each class were revealed in a golden envelope and they each had a week to work towards their new skill. Reception class learnt the alphabet in sign language; Year 1 learnt a tongue-twister; Year 2 learnt how to play a song on the recorder; Year 3 learnt a rapid and repetitive clapping game; Year 4 learnt how to say the alphabet in French; and Years 5/6 learnt how to juggle!

'Resilience Week' builds upon the success of the other recent learning behaviour celebration: 'Teamwork Day'. Both of these help to equip children with essential skills which can also support their mental wellbeing.
