WORSHIP & ASSEMBLIES

This term, children across different classes have enjoyed joining together for face-to-face Worship and assemblies, taking steps towards whole school Worship/Assembly in the hall. We are very proud of the children for how well they have adapted to the steps so far and how they are managing this transition.

Although staff endeavour to reply to emails, these will not always be instant and certainly not late at night, or possibly at weekends, as we, as a Trust, have guidelines on when staff are able to use work emails, in order to support their wellbeing.

We might collect sensitive data if we were concerned about your safety that we would usually report to you first. Your messages are reviewed and sent on to the other health care staff who follow the same confidentiality rules. We aim to reply to you within one working day and you should get an immediate message back to confirm we have received your text. Texts will only be sent between 9am and 5pm. If you need help before you have been in contact your GP, please walk in or call 111. Our text number does not receive voice calls or MMS picture messages. We request messages from all mobile numbers only. Texts are not sent to landlines, unregistered mobile numbers and some mobile numbers may not be able to receive texts. To prevent the health visitor from sending messages to you, text STOP to our number. Messages are charged at your usual rates.

STAYING NUT FREE

To continue to keep everyone safe in school, may we remind all that **NO nuts, or nut-based snacks/lunch** should come into school with your child.

DROPPING-OFF & COLLECTING

Although we have reported a number of positive Covid-19 cases in school this term, we hope that, with your help, these will continue to reduce in regularity. Of course, many of the Covid-19 restrictions have been removed in society (including in school) and although you will be aware that we are no longer requesting face coverings and social distancing on the school driveways, we do kindly request that the decisions of any parents/carers, relatives, friends, or staff to wear face coverings are respected and that we are mindful of them having a little space. Many of us may have different feelings about the pandemic, and some amongst us have experienced great loss, sadness, or have vulnerable relatives to whom we wish to minimise risk by wearing face coverings. Thank you for your support.
