Below is a brief outline of the curriculum areas which we will be focusing upon in class throughout the first part of the Spring term in Class Three.

Please note that the below is a summary and may change over the course of the term based on the children's needs and interests. It does, however, offer insight to enable you to further support your child's learning outside school.

During the Spring Term, Class Three will have P.E. on a **Monday** and **Friday**. Please ensure that your child has the appropriate P.E. kit (including footwear) in school on these days, including an outdoor kit.

Class Three will also be taking part in **Forest School** sessions on a Tuesday throughout the first part of the Spring term. Please ensure that your child has the appropriate equipment in school on this day. (Please see separate letter).

Homework will be sent home on a Wednesday and be due in on the following Wednesday. Weekly homework will consist of ten spellings (found on the school

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website on the Class Three page) and a Maths activity (no more than thirty minutes). It is also the expectation in Upper Key Stage 2 that your child is reading for twenty minutes per night. If this can be documented in your child's home learning diary, either by yourself or your child, that would be greatly appreciated. Your child also has access to TTRockstars to help boost their timetable recall knowledge.
